 - New Hepatitis A State Action Plan

 - ➤ Focus on post-term related problems (e.g., medication availability)
 - Open Water Safety



2018 Reporting Deadline

- Approx. 9-months behind schedule
- Delays due to:
 - ➤ Delay in the rollout of new national standards
 - Delay in education materials being updated accordingly to the new standards
 - ➤ Delay in error-free data layouts and 2018-compliant vendor software to abstract cases based on new standards
- New deadline for reporting 2018 cancers cases is March 31, 2020

 - All inpatient and ambulatory patient encounters 1/1/2018
 - 12/31/2018



2018 Reporting Deadline

- Please take your time to learn the new coding rules and avoid using 'unknown' or 'not available'
- Please ensure you are submitting a QUALITY abstract
- Complete and accurate data ensure that we are describing the cancer burden accordingly for the following:

 - ▼ State Cancer Plan
- On the horizon, data capture to include:
 - Cancer screening for breast and cervical cancers
 - Infections HIV/AIDS, HCV
 - VA cancer data
 - Biomarkers



- Reporting: Social Security Number REQUIRED
 - Mandated per Rule 64D-3 Florida Administrative Code
 - Diseases or conditions of public health significance MUST BE REPORTED by the practitioner, hospital, laboratory, or other entity or individual and the disease report must include at minimum:
 - Patient's first and last name, including middle initial
 - Patient's address, including city, state, and zip code
 - ➤ Patient's telephone number, including area code
 - Patient's date of birth
 - × Patient's sex
 - Patient's race and ethnicity



- Complete and accurately transcribed SSN must be entered on ALL CANCER ABSTRACTS submitted to FCDS
- There is NO EXCEPTIONS, FULL SSN must be submitted
- The FCDS cannot accept:
 - Partial SSN
 - Last 4-digits
 - Last 6-digits
 - **▼** IT or billing system generated proxy SSN
 - ▼ Unknown SSN *unless truly not captured in the medical record
