





Age-adjusted Death Rate per 100,000 Floridians in 2015




Florida's Cancer Problem

Florida Cancer Geography Age-Adjusted Cancer Incidence Rates by County



Cancer Types by Crude Number of Diagnoses


Every year, approximately 110,000 Floridians are diagnosed with cancer. In terms of crude number of cases, lung cancer is the most frequently diagnosed cancer in Florida, followed by breast cancer, prostate cancer, colorectal cancer, and bladder cancer.


Trend in Cancer Mortality Rate in Florida










4. Florida versus U.S.










Unfunded Florida Cancer Research Proposals with **No or Negligible Weaknesses**







Annual Spending for Tobacco-Related Communications in Florida









Florida Population Growth 1820-2020





Male Population of Florida


Florida Age Distribution 2015

Female Population of Florida





