## 2023 Jean Byers Award for Excellence in Cancer Registration

After two years of having to cancel the Jean Byers Memorial Award recognition, FCDS is happy to announce that, once again, we are on the right track to be able to present the 2023 **Jean Byers Award for Excellence in Cancer Registration** to those facilities that meet or exceed the national quality standards for timeliness and completeness in cancer reporting.

**The Jean Byers Award** is presented to any facility that meets the following criteria:

- All Deadlines met with respect to cancer case admissions and all cases reported to FCDS:  
**Annual Caseload Submission Deadline – June 30, 2022**  
**Consolidated Follow Back Deadline – September 1, 2023**
- No more than 5% (or 35 cases, whichever number is greater) of cancer case admissions reported to FCDS within 2 months (60 days) following the June 30, 2022 deadline
- No more than 10% of cancer case admissions reported to FCDS within 12 months following the June 30, 2022 reporting deadline

# Florida Cancer Data System Deadlines, Updates, & Reminders

## Annual Reporting Deadline June 30, 2024

Florida law requires that all cancer cases diagnosed/treated for cancer, having a cancer-related health visit while undergoing cancer treatment, or having any evidence of disease at the time of encounter must be abstracted and reported to FCDS within six months of the date of first encounter for cancer. See the reporting calendar below.

FCDS requires that facilities transmit data at least quarterly. Monthly data submission is highly recommended for large facilities reporting over 500 cases annually.

The deadline to submit all 2023 cases is June 30, 2024. Please be sure to Certify Complete in IDEA if you have reported all the 2023 cases. If not, please develop a remedial plan to bring the facility back into compliance with state statutes. The plan must also include a statement indicating how the facility plans to stay compliant once the current reporting year has been completed and compliance has been reached for the year in question.

## Radiation Treatment Facilities- REPORTING DEADLINE

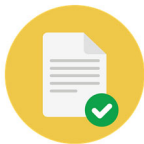
### IDENTIFICATION OF CANCER CASES DIAGNOSED AND/OR TREATED AT RADIATION TREATMENT FACILITIES BETWEEN JANUARY 1, 2023 AND DECEMBER 31, 2023

The Florida Cancer Data System is requesting that Radiation Treatment facilities identify and report the cancer cases that were diagnosed and/or treated at their facility between **January 1, 2023, and December 31, 2023.**

The deadline to submit the list of cancer cases is June 30, 2024. After the June 30th deadline, FCDS will match the submitted records with the FCDS database and request a full cancer case abstract for each patient not found through the match.

State law requires the information requested. Facilities that fail to meet state-mandated cancer incidence data reporting requirements to the FCDS are referred to the Florida Department of Health for non-compliance. Please note that “failure to comply with this requirement may be cause for registration or licensure suspension or revocation,” per Section 385.202 F.S.

## FCDS 2022 Consolidated Follow Back Audit

FCDS matched the 2022 In-Patient and Out-Patient Discharges reported the facilities' Finance-Billing/Medical Records Department to the Agency for Health Care Administration (AHCA). All records with principal or secondary cancer diagnoses were linked to the FCDS database. A match was also completed of the Florida Vital Statistics Death Certificates for 2022. All non-matching records have been placed in your queue for review. The Consolidated Follow Back audit combines AHCA, Ambulatory Surgery Center (AMBI), and the Death Clearance follow-back process into a single follow-back queue.

The 2022 Consolidated Follow-Back records are available in IDEA for review.

The facilities are responsible for reviewing each case online. If the case is found to be not reportable, assign the appropriate disposition code; if the record was previously reported to FCDS assign disposition code 07, accession number, and sequence number, then press the Submit button. Any case found to meet the FCDS Cancer Case Reporting Requirements outlined in Section I of the FCDS DAM and found not to have been previously reported must be reported to FCDS. These are considered missed reportable cases. Assign a disposition code of 01, accession number, and sequence number to the reportable cases and press the Submit button.

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**These disposition code 01 records (missed cases) must be electronically reported to FCDS within 30 days of assigning the disposition code. After 30 days, the record(s) will be returned to the queue and marked as incomplete.**

**The deadline to complete the review and submission of missed cases is September 1, 2024.**

Please remember that all FCDS audits are dictated and closely monitored by the Florida Department of Health. Facilities failing to meet the reporting requirements will be reported to DOH for non-compliance. Should you have any questions, please contact your Field Coordinator at (305) 243-4600.

The Florida Cancer Data System is happy to announce the FCDS 2024 Virtual Annual Conference, which will be held September 17-18, 2024, from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m.

FCDS encourages all Florida Cancer Registrars, interim staffing companies, and Individual contractors to attend both days. Each will provide completely different but equally relevant information on cancer registration. The conference will be free of charge and recorded.

In addition, FCDS will offer up to 8 Continuing Education hours awarded by NCRA.

## A Well-documented Abstract

All central registries that report to NPCR require text documentation. Supporting text should be on all coded data items in your abstract for both analytic and non-analytic cases. If information is unavailable, state it in the abstract in the appropriate text data item. Do not simply document NA. Provide a good history of why the cancer is reported and why the patient presented to your facility. All data items must be well documented. The text helps with audits by including the primary site of origin, demographics, seer summary stage, SSDIs, and treatment administered. Your abstract text should tell a story and make sense when auditors review it. Text documentation is an essential component of a complete electronic report and is heavily utilized for quality control, visual QC, and special studies. Text is needed to justify coded values and to document supplemental information not transmitted within coded values. High-quality text documentation facilitates consolidating information from multiple reporting sources at the central registry.

### **Text documentation should always include the following components:**

- Include in the patient's history and the reason for the visit to the facility regardless of class of case and if there is an active disease, history, or the patient is currently undergoing treatment.
- The primary site should include text to support the subsite code.
- Location includes the facility, physician, and other locations where the event occurred or the patient was diagnosed, including tests, studies, and treatment.
- Provide dates (chronological order) and descriptions of events, including tests, studies and treatment administered and types if results were positive or negative.

### **Treatment supporting text:**

- The surgery text should include all surgical procedures performed, the procedure's name, and if lymph node resection was performed to support what is coded in the scope of regional nodes.
- For radiation, include dates, location, site treated, and treatment modality.
- For chemo, hormones, immunotherapy includes each agent by name, not just by protocol name.

The SEER summary stage text includes the extent of disease, which may include TNM if available, and the rationale for code.

Please read the Introduction to Text Documentation, which precedes this section, to become familiar with FCDS text requirements. The text requirements are monitored by FCDS QC Review and through FCDS EDITS.

## FCDS achieves the NAACCR Gold Standard Certification once again!

FCDS is proud and happy to announce that the North American Association of Central Cancer Registries (NAACCR) has recognized the Florida Cancer Data System nationally at the highest level of certification, NAACCR GOLD Standard Certification, with the November 2023 Call for Data.

Gold certification is only awarded to state and central cancer registries that meet the highest completeness, data quality, and timeliness levels in cancer registry surveillance. Additionally, our data will be included in the Cancer in North America (CINA), the United States Cancer Statistics (USCS), and the Annual Report to the Nation on the Status of Cancer datasets, publications, and research projects.

This is a remarkable accomplishment. It is a statewide team effort among the FCDS, the University of Miami, the Florida Department of Health, and all of our cancer registrars and cancer case reporters around the state.

FCDS would like to thank each of you for your hard work and dedication to our work. Through your efforts, you have made and continue to make Florida one of the top registries in the country.







## Unknown Date of Diagnosis and Treatment

The primary objective of the Florida Cancer Data System (FCDS) is to maintain a high-quality database of usable, timely, complete, and accurate data for every case of cancer identified in the state of Florida. The first course of treatment administered must be captured and reported to the state for all cancer cases.

FCDS does not accept an unknown date for the initial diagnosis. There are instructions in the FCDS Data Acquisition Manual on how to estimate the Date of Diagnosis when no information is available in the medical record. Do not use the date of admission as the date of diagnosis. You will receive an edit if the first contact date precedes the date of diagnosis by more than 30 days. It is very important to do everything possible to at least determine the year of diagnosis.

Cancer Registry software applications may allow registrars to default treatment core data items to 99 if unknown. If you do not know if treatment was recommended, performed, or refused, code to 00 (not performed) versus 99. Treatment should never be coded as 99 if you know it was performed. Treatment Recommended or Refused must be documented in the medical record, and it must be coded in the required treatment data items with supporting text documentation for all reportable cases. These instructions are for analytic or non-analytic cases.

Do not guess if treatment was performed or not. Do not presume treatment should have been recommended based on published Treatment Guidelines. Refer to the history and physical exam notes to identify if surgery or other treatment was performed for a patient with recurrence or progression of their disease. FCDS only captures first-course treatment and supporting text. If subsequent treatment(s) was administered due to a recurrence or progression, document in your text fields. Code all treatments administered, recommended, and refused, regardless of where they were done or how complete is your information.

FCDS recognizes that the medical record history and physical exams often include mention of a 'history of cancer' but provide little, if any, information regarding when or where the diagnosis or initial treatment occurred. This is why, for many years, FCDS has allowed registrars to enter blanks, 9s, or use the Date of Admission as a proxy for the Date of Initial Diagnosis when no information was available in the medical record. This is generally applied to non-analytic cases seen at your facility with current evidence of cancer and historical-only cases with no evidence of cancer reported to FCDS in the historical grid when new cancer has been diagnosed (multiple primaries diagnosed over the patient's lifetime). FCDS requires every case that you abstract (analytic, non-analytic, and historical grid cases) to include, at a minimum, a valid year of diagnosis.

**2023-2024 Monthly NAACCR Cancer Surveillance Webinar Series**

FCDS is pleased to offer another year of the Monthly NAACCR Cancer Registry and Surveillance Webinar Series - Free of Charge to Florida Registrars in Recorded Sessions.

NAACCR is providing FCDS with 110 live attendance portals for 110 Florida registrars.

For registrars who do not make the short list for the live sessions, FCDS offers every NAACCR Webinar as a recorded session in FLccSC. You can still earn 3 CEUs per webinar in FLccSC. Recordings appear in FLccSC within a week or two following the live session

The 2023-2024 NAACCR Webinar Series begins on October 5, 2023 and continues through September 4, 2024. The 2023-2024 Webinar Series Schedule is provided below.

FCDS and NAACCR have an established agreement whereby any Florida FLccSC User MUST have *at least* one 'Active' User Permission or User Access Role in at least one Florida facility in IDEA to view NAACCR Webinar Recordings. All other recordings are available to any user with or without a FCDS IDEA User Role. User Roles must be updated every 6 months. FCDS recently introduced automation of access permissions that will check your individual access permission status every time you log into FLccSC regardless of how you access FLccSC (via IDEA or web). If you do not have current access to at least one facility you will not be given permission to access the NAACCR Recordings. The recordings will not even show up in your FLccSC Available Courses Menu.
